For the past twelve years, the Connecticut Trauma Conference has strived to provide the best education available in the field of trauma and critical care. This goal has not changed. The Program Committee has invited loco-regional and national experts in the field, some of whom have spoken here in the past. The focus of the conference this year is on the continuum of trauma care, with a unique format of a case based scenario debuting this year. Other topics will focus on common non-trauma diseases treated at trauma centers, pediatric trauma care and prevention, and what is on the horizon for trauma care. - 6 To discuss the trauma response to the earthquake in Haiti with a focus on the challenges encountered in care delivery in an austere environment
- To review the challenges in State disaster response highlighted by the Middletown Plant explosion
- 8 To discuss interesting case presentations and novel management strategies for their management.
